## OUTGOING INTERNATIONAL VISITING FELLOWSHIP PROGRAMME 2020/21

## **CALL FOR APPLICATIONS**

## **Deadline 10 November 2019**

The Leibniz ScienceCampus "Europe and America in the Modern World" invites professors, lecturers (Akademische Rät\*innen, including a.Z.) and postdoctoral researchers from the University of Regensburg and the Leibniz Institute for East and Southeast European Studies (IOS) to apply for the Outgoing International Visiting Fellow Programme. Successful applicants will receive funding towards a one-month stay at one of the ScienceCampus' international strategic partners located across Europe and both North and South America. The ScienceCampus is a joint project by the Leibniz Institute for East and Southeast European Studies (IOS) and the University of Regensburg. It is supported by a grant from the Leibniz Association. The ScienceCampus seeks to strengthen collaboration between the Leibniz Institute and the University by creating a visible research cluster and an interdisciplinary platform for scholarly exchange in Area Studies. The international fellowship program for both incoming and outgoing scholars is one of the ScienceCampus' key pillars.

"Europe and America in the Modern World" explores frictions, contradictions and ambiguous transformations of globality since around 1800. The ScienceCampus investigations regional diversity within Europe and the Americas in the context of these areas' entanglements with other parts of the globe. Applicants to the fellowship program should be pursuing a research project that advances the discussions within the ScienceCampus' five **Interdisciplinary Research Modules**:

- Transatlantic political transformations
- Cultures and hierarchies of translations
- Trade and institutions
- Practices of belonging (Verheimatlichung)
- Towards Multi-Polar and Multi-Scalar Area Studies

We invite postdoctoral researchers, lecturers and senior faculty based in Regensburg to take up one-month fellowships with our strategic international partners. The fellowship programme offers a contribution towards travel and accommodation costs, weighted

according to expenses associated with each location. Where necessary, requests for support with any additional visiting scholar fees levied by partners will be considered. Successful applicants should play an active role in projects and events associated with the relevant Research Modules before and after completing their research stay. We expect successful applicants to contribute to the new ScienceCampus blog which will launch in mid-2020.

Applicants should send the following documents by **10 November 2019** as a single PDF document – in English or German – to Dr Paul Vickers, manager of the ScienceCampus, at <a href="mailto:campus@europeamerica.de">campus@europeamerica.de</a>:

- a CV and list of publications
- a two-page abstract of your ongoing research project
- a covering letter outlining your **TOP THREE** choices of partner institution in order of preference; the letter should explain how a research stay would further both your ongoing research and the objectives of the ScienceCampus
- a note stating when you would intend to travel within the next eighteen months (to the end of Winter Semester 2020/21).

The applications will be reviewed by the Board of Directors of the Leibniz ScienceCampus. Successful applicants will be notified within four weeks of the deadline, with the Board communicating where a visiting fellowship would be possible and how much funding would be available.
